



# HEARTS & ROSES ANNOUNCEMENT

## LITTLE B PRODUCTS

- White Frame for 4x6 photo
- Straight Blade Knife
- Metal Edge Ruler
- Announcement Photograph
- Envelopes

## HEART ANNOUNCEMENT and ENVELOPES

- Add sparkle and elegance to your announcements and invitations with Gold Foil Hearts Specialty Foil Tape.
- Create fun borders on your photos and inside envelopes by adding Gold Foil Love 3mm Tape to either side of the Gold Foil Hearts Specialty Foil 25mm Tape.
- Seal the flap of your envelopes by adding Gold Foil Hearts Specialty Foil 25mm Tape over the edges of the envelope flap – making sure to overlap the tape at the point of the flap.
- Place the metal edge ruler over the intersection point of the Tape. Cut through both layers of tape with the straight blade knife. Remove the excess Tape and press Tape together to create a perfectly mitered Tape point.
- Cut off any excess Tape that is off the sides of the envelope with the straight blade knife.

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## ROSE FRAME – MITERED CORNERS

- Place the photo frame flat on your creative working space.
- Begin at the top left side of the frame. To start, you will want to leave about 1 inch of the Gold Foil Rose Tape OFF the left edge of the frame and continue placing the tape down as you move horizontally across the top edge of the frame. Make sure that the tape remains level and not becoming crooked. To do this, use the straight edge of the frame as a level reference and check it often visually. Don't worry if you have gone "astray" because you can peel the tape back up and level it back up. *Little B™ tape is so forgiving and fun!* Continue sticking the tape down until you reach the top right side of the frame. Use the handy cutter on the Little B™ package to cut the tape – leaving a 1 inch piece beyond the edge of the frame.
- Rotate the frame 90 degrees to the right, so you now have a blank edge of the frame at the top.
- Repeat the steps above to place a piece of tape across the next top edge of the frame. Remember to allow an inch or so overhang on both sides of the frame. Note that you intentionally will be placing tape over tape on the right side – leaving an inch off the right edge. (Now 2 edges of the frame have tape on them.)
- Rotate the frame 90 degrees to the right, so you now have the next blank edge of the frame at the top.
- Repeat the steps above to place a piece of tape across the next top edge of the frame. (Now 3 edges have tape on them.)
- Rotate the frame 90 degrees to the right, so you now have the last blank edge of the frame at the top.
- Repeat the steps above to place a piece of tape across the top edge of the frame. Remember to allow an inch or so overhang on both sides of the frame. Note that on this last side, you will be placing tape over tape on both the left and right sides. (Now all 4 edges of the frame have tape on them. And yes, the tape is overlapping each corner.)
- Position the frame so the top of the frame is again at the top.
- Start with mitering the upper left corner first.
- Place the cutting side of the metal edge ruler so that it is diagonally lined up between the outside corner of the overlapped tape and the inside corner of the overlapped tape. Hold the ruler firmly in place.
- Carefully take your straight edge blade knife and cut diagonally from the outside corner to the inside corner of the tape. Press firmly enough to cut through both layers of tape, although not hard enough to cut into the surface of the frame. A sharp blade will allow you to cut more easily.
- Rotate the frame 90 degrees to the right.
- Repeat the steps above to make a mitered cut on the 2nd corner, 3rd corner and on the 4th and final corner.
- Lay the knife and ruler aside.
- *Now here comes the fun part . . . revealing the perfectly mitered corners of your frame!*
- Start with the upper left corner and grab the 1 inch excess piece of tape which is going off the top of the frame and peel it down toward the frame. It should remove easily at the diagonal cut. Throw this piece of excess tape away. (I make a pile of excess tape off to the right of my project – just add to the pile until you are done and throw it all away at once.)
- While still working on the upper left corner, peel the top layer of vertical tape down – this will reveal the bottom layer of tape. Grab the excess piece of tape that is off the left side of the frame and peel towards the right. It should remove easily at the diagonal cut. Add this piece of excess tape to your discard pile.
- *Note – If you did not cut through both layers of tape, you can reset the ruler in the exact spot and cut through the tape.* Resist the urge to use just the knife without the straight edge – you will be happier with a perfectly straight cut. Trust me on this – I have tried both ways.
- Press both sides of the mitered tape together against the frame.
- Isn't that awesome how they perfectly line up? Great job!
- You know the routine – Rotate the frame 90 degrees to the right and work on removing the tape to reveal the 2nd perfectly mitered corner! Awesome! Great job!
- Repeat to remove the excess tape to reveal the 3rd and 4th beautifully mitered corners.
- Insert your chosen photo into the frame and display it proudly.
- When you want to change the photo, you can also change the tape.
- Have fun creating Quick, Easy and Perfect Every Time Mitered Corners with Little B™ Tape on more than just frames . . .
